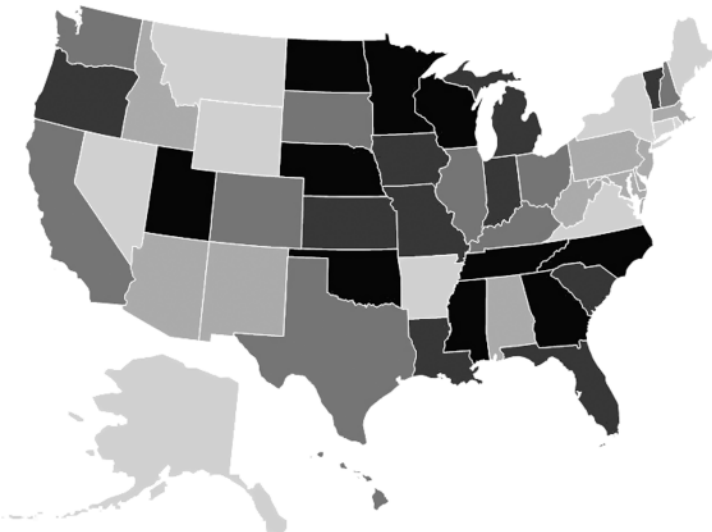
Major concern: self-reported data.

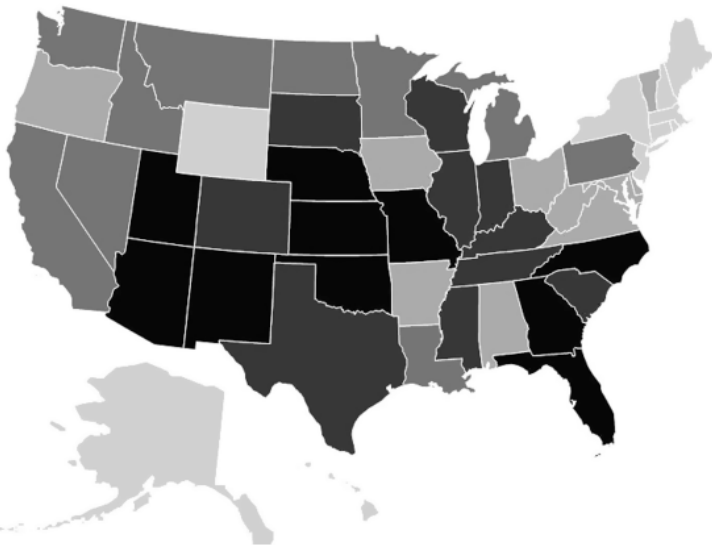

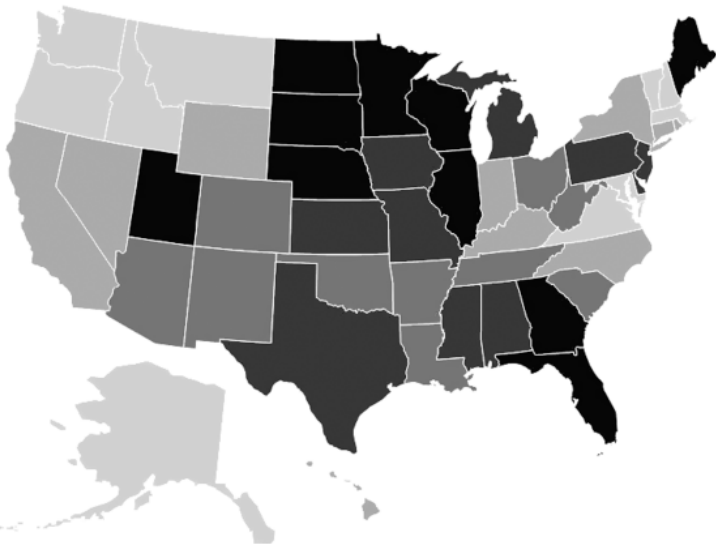

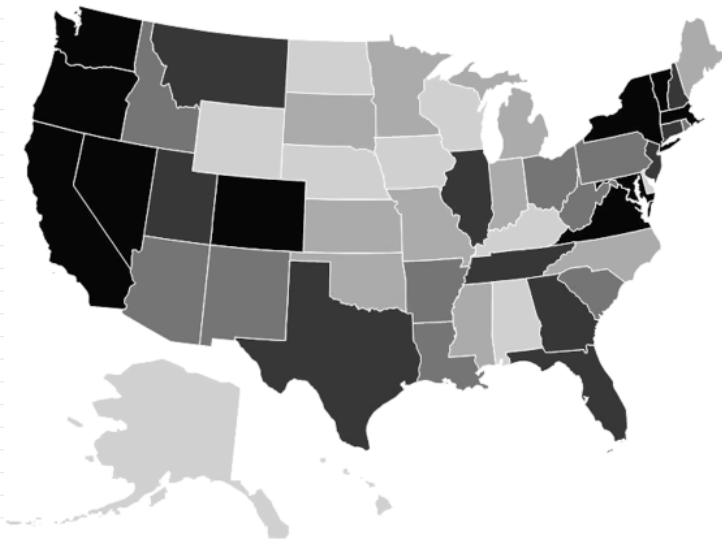
